Brunch Fundraiser Notes:

- 1) Choose a date, time and location (preferably someone's home that can host 50 +)
- 2) Send flyer to various Branch Churches in your area, alumni of DiscoveryBound (DB Headquarters would have this) and families that support DiscoveryBound.
- 3) Donations of food were made by people or donations from grocery stores, bagel and doughnut shops (give them a flyer and tell them that you are non-profit)
- 4) Fee: Donations accepted for brunch (we did not set a price)
- 5) Check-In Table: Basket for donations, sign in book (1 page of name, address, phone number) and Help List (What are your chapter's needs?) Copy of desserts to be auctioned off with teens names, Menu of Brunch
- 6) (2) Tables set up near check-in table to display desserts that are to be auctioned off. (name of teen and dessert)
- 7) Display posters, flyers and photo albums of DB local, Regional and National events throughout the house. You can also have a video of your local activities showing throughout the day.
- 8) The Menu: Make it simple and get the kids involved.
 Bagels, doughnuts, homemade waffles and pancakes, strawberries, fruit bowl, homemade breads, yogurt, granola, coffee, OJ and punch.
- 9) Juniors and Teens Involvement: Have the kids make waffles and pancakes,, set the table, make sure that the food is displayed nicely and bring desserts to be auctioned off.
- 10) Auctioneer: You do not need a professional. Find someone who is energetic, loves DB and will have a great time with the audience. Have each teen come forward with their dessert (one at a time) and have them share with the audience what it is, etc.. The auctioneer then will start the bidding!

The Boston Youth DiscoveryBound Chapter experienced a joyous and bountiful 2008. It has been an amazing year of activities focusing on a lot of the National Programs and more teens attending CS camp this past summer. The fruitage from the teens and parents show evidence of growth in their understanding of God and Christian Science. The friendships they form during these events will last a lifetime. We want to share with you some of the highlights of this past year as well as tell you about our exciting plans for 2009

Last May 30 teens attended the Focus Series on the ARTS in New York City. They had an opportunity to enjoy workshops with experienced Christian Science artists in theatre, dance, music or the visual arts. They saw a Broadway Show, "Lion King" with dinner at Times Square, engaged in spiritual discussions sessions, with their peers, had lunch at Central Park and enjoyed a dinner/dance harbor cruise.

One of the most inspiring and well-attended events with DiscoveryBound took place over Labor Day Weekend at Principia College. This event was a Leadership Conference for teens and chapter workers. 26 teens and our Boston adult board attended this event and over 500 were in attendance. The theme throughout the weekend was "Be the light". Teens enjoyed sessions such as "Shine Together", building strong relationships, "Illumine Your Identity", not personality, or body, but what you know spiritually and "A light unto your path", bringing the Bible to life. Active sessions for teens were solar car, mammoth dig, photography, and radio broadcasting. Adult sessions were, "On location", incorporating inspiration into activities, "The Next Generation", becoming tech savvy through web communication and resources.

Our most recent National Program took place in Tampa, Florida over President's Day Weekend. It focused on the Environment. We had 11 teens from the Boston area attend. They heard how individuals were making a difference by applying Christian Science in the fields of environmental protection, animal and habitat preservation, and green architecture. Teens could choose from swimming with the manatees and an airboat tour or visit a rescue/rehab aquarium with an ecoboat tour. They had an opportunity to experience Florida's natural and wildlife habitat.

We continue to have an active chapter and as always our chapter brings the most participants to these programs thanks to your financial support. We are touching many lives with teens and they are most appreciative!

Other exciting events and activities during the past year included:

Over Memorial Day Weekend, teens plan to attend the Boston Youth Meeting. Teens from all over the US will be attending. They will explore the city, the Christian Science Plaza (including the original edifice and the Mary Baker Eddy Library for the Betterment of Humanity) and learn more history from the Longyear Museum and Chestnut Hill home. They will share ideas with their peers and elevate thought through small discussion sessions and Sunday School at the Mother Church. Other activities will include a foot rally on the Freedom Trail and enjoy a Boston Harbor Cruise.

Over Labor Day Weekend, we plan to attend the Focus Series on the Entertainment Industry in Los Angeles, CA. The teens will meet and talk with professionals in all facets of the biz and they will share how they use Christian Science in their work and apply spiritual truths to the creative process. They will have a chance to explore the city as well! We have already booked 30 seats for this event!

Our fund-raising strategy for 2009 includes individual contributions, local grants and fund-raising events sponsored by our chapter youth. How will this money be used? The largest percentage will be used to help our teens attend regionals and national programs, which usually include travel expenses. Also, our local chapter, with over 100 families, hosts a variety of events and activities, most of which require admissions fees, facility rentals, and transportation costs. And finally, we offer financial aid to help kids attend any Christian Science camp of their choice. Any contribution you can make to support our chapter is greatly appreciated. This past year we have seen an increase in attendance with new participants, but also an increase in event expenses such as rising transportation costs. Also, more parents are seeking financial assistance for their participation.

We invite you to our Brunch/Dessert Auction Fundraiser that will take place on Sunday, May 17th from 12:30-3:00 p.m. in Lincoln, MA. Enjoy a delicious brunch prepared and served by our youth and participate in an auction of delicious desserts made by youth! (See enclosed flyer.)
