It was a meeting of bishops called by Constantine to resolve thorny theological issues that were dividing the church, hence the Empire. The bishops debated whether or not Jesus was God or just the son of God. First vote was son of God, second vote he became God. This issue was not totally decided until 380, when the concept of the trinity was adopted and the Roman Emperor threatened to excommunicate and/or execute anyone who didn't accept it as dogma.

Introduced monotheism, angels, Satan, judgment day, heaven and hell. Jews exiled to Babylon adopted his ideas and brought them back to Jerusalem when they rebuilt the temple. In the same way that the SAT doesn't really gauge your success in life, the CSAT doesn't gauge your success in practicing Christian Science. Mrs. Eddy says, "Mere historic incidents and personal events are frivolous and of no moment, unless they illustrate the ethics of Truth." (R&I p21) However, since most of the information can be gleaned from reading the *Science & Health with Key to the Scriptures*, her other writings, the Manual, and the biographies, your performance on the CSAT is a reflection on how much time you've spent reading and studying them. Hopefully, the CSAT will help you identify what you need to study in order to live Science and discuss it more intelligently with others.

What happened to her biological son?

After George W. Glover Sr. died, Mary was sick and single, so her son was sent away and put under the care of the family nurse. She married Daniel Patterson to get back her child, but instead he was shipped to South Dakota and told that his mother was dead. They reconnected when he was 34, but they were never close.

Name at least one healing system Mrs. Eddy experimented with?

Mrs. Eddy experimented with allopathy, homeopathy, electricity, hydropathy, and magnetism trying to trace all physical effects to a mental cause (R&I 33)

She fell on the ice, sustained a life-threatening injury, and was fully restored after reading an account of Jesus’ healing.

How does the Christian Science view of Jesus differ from other Christian denominations?

Most Christian churches believe in the Trinity: the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost combined in one Godhead. So Jesus is God, and they when say they are praying to God, they mean Jesus. This concept of the Trinity was developed in the 4th Century as a compromise solution to the debate over whether or not Jesus was God, and Mrs. Eddy rejected it. She defines Christ as “the divine manifestation of God, which comes to the flesh to destroy incarnate error” and Jesus as “the highest human corporeal concept of the divine idea, rebuking and destroying error and bringing to light man's immortality.”

They also believe that God created Adam in His image and likeness but that he “fell” by committing original sin, and that Jesus’ crucifixion redeemed all that are baptized vicariously.

According to Article XXXIII of the Manual, the Committee is a person whose duty is to “correct in a Christian manner impositions on the public in regard to Christian Science, injustices done Mrs. Eddy or members of this Church by the daily press, by periodicals, or circulated literature of any sort.” A Committee also deals with legislative affairs at the State and National levels.

What is a C.S.O.?

According to Article XXIII, Section 8 of the Manual, “members in good standing with The Mother Church, who are members of the faculty, instructors, or students in any university or college, can form and conduct a Christian Science organization...”

What is primary class instruction? How long does it last?

A two-week class taught by a sanctioned teacher (C.S.B.) based on the chapter called Recapitulation in Science & Health

What is an “association”? How often does it meet?

An association is the students of a teacher, which gather once per year, for another day of instruction
